INTRODUCTION.

BEFORE proceeding to show that the first of the Traills of Orkney was a cadet of the family of Traill of Blebo, in Fifeshire, it may not be amiss to glance at several of the earlier notices of Traills.

Without attempting to trace their descent from the time of William the Conqueror, it is worthy of note that the name of *Tirell* occurs in the Roll of Battle Abbey. In Anderson's Genealogy and Surnames, published by William Ritchie, Edinburgh, in 1865, he states that *Traill* is supposed to have been originally *Tyrell*. Again, Fordun, in his Scottish Chronicle, speaking of Bishop Walter Traill of St Andrews, spells his name *Walterus Treyll* (he

was a contemporary of the Bishop A.D. 1385 to 1401), and in another place he refers to a *Walterus Treyl* as the unfortunate man who was unwittingly the cause of the death of William Rufus. His account of the accident is so quaint and curious that I make no apology for inserting it here in the original Latin:- "Treyl Walterus Willelmum II. Angliae Regem casu interficit." "Ubi in Saltu percussus pectore sagitta quam jecerat Gualterus Treyl Miles quidam de Franci æ, qui cervum proposuit per-cutere sed cecidit in Regem et Rex cecidit in necem A.D.M.C."

In Banks' dormant and extinct Baronage we find a William de Traill, witness to a charter in the time of Henry I. Fordun too, describes a Tournament at Berwick in the reign of Robert III., where an English champion, named Robert Morley, who, on the first day, had vanquished all opponents, did on the morrow, encounter Sir Thomas Treyl, a nephew of Bishop Walter Treyl of St Andrews, and was then altogether defeated.

In Sibbald's Fife and Kinross, Bishop Treyl is said to be a son of the House of Blebo ; and in Keith's Catalogue of Scottish Bishops a simi-lar statement is made. Early writers speak of

Bishop Treyl in high terms of eulogy. Buchanan considered that the three national calamities of Scotland., in 1401 were the deaths of Earl Douglas ,Queen Annabelle., and Walter Treyl, Bishop of St Andrews. According to Fordun Bishop Treyl] was " Referendarus papae Cle-mentis septimi," and was attending that Pontif at Avignon, when a vacancy in the see of St Andrews took place. So high was the opinion of Clement as to his learning and worth, that by his own authority, without any election, he ap-pointed him to the Bishopric saying "This man deserveth better to be Pope than Bishop; the place is better provided than the person" There was a Latin inscription over his tomb in the Cathedral of St Andrews as follows:- "Hic fuit Ecclesiæ directa columna, fenestra lucida, thuribulum redolens, campana sonora." or in English, "He was an upright pillar of the Church, a bright window, a sweet censer, and melodious bell."

Many other descendants of the Blebo Traills were distinguished men in the Church and in the Army; but perhaps few of them are more worthy of notice than the Rev. Robert Trail, minister of Elie, in Fife, and afterwards of the

Greyfriars' Church in Edinburgh. He was born in 1603. His father was Colonel James Trail and his mother Matilda Melville of Carnbee, in Fife. His grandfather, Colonel Andrew Traill, a most distinguished officer, was second son of Alexander, a younger brother of the laird of Blebo. Robert had an older brother, James, born in 1600, who was a Lieutenant-Colonel in Cromwell's Army. Robert appears to have inherited something of the military ardour of his ancestors, for we find it stated in a M.S. account of the Trails of Fife that, having taken refuge in Edinburgh Castle during Oliver Cromwell's invasion, in the year 1659, he refused to treat with Cromwell. He encouraged the garrison to hold out. He was himself wounded in the siege; and when Cromwell at length took the Castle and offered kindness to Robert Trail, on account of his brother, Mr Trail up-braided him as a persecutor of God's people, and said that he desired none of his favours!

Cromwell, however, appears to have acted with magnanimity, and ordered that Mr. Trail's effects should be carefully brought out of the Castle and carried safely to his house. An original picture of him, taken during his subse-

quent banishment in Holland, is or was in the possession of the Earl. of Buchan, who was related to the family through Sir James Stewart of Goodtrees.

A descendant of Robert Traill's, who pre-sented the picture to the Earl, seems to have had a most erroneous impression of the genealogy of his family, for he had written on the back of the picture, " Mr Robert Traill was the son of Traill of Blebo in Fife, of a very antient Norweggian family long since established by the name of *Troll*, in the *island* of Orkney!."

Robert Traill's great-grandson, James, took orders in the Church of England, and became Bishop of Down and Connor in 1763.

Some degree of obscurity hangs over the exact time at which one if not two sons of the laird of Blebo removed to Orkney; but in the opinion of the best authorities, including David Balfour of Balfour, George Traill, the ancestor of the present Traills of Orkney, was a younger son of Alexander Traill of Blebo.

On referring to my notes on the Fife Traills, I find that the name of Alexander Traill of Blebo occurs uninterruptedly from the year

1564 to 1583; and from about that time up to 1622, there were at least three successive John Traills of Blebo.

Through the courtesy of the present pro-prietor of Blebo, I had an opportunity, some years ago, of examining a vast number of letters and documents referring to the former Traills of Blebo. I had not then time at my disposal to read more than a third part of the papers in a cursory manner; and although I gleaned some important genealogical facts, I failed to discover anything relating to the date on which certain younger members of that family settled in the Orkney islands.

In Peterkin's Orkney Rentals there is a John Traill mentioned as holding land there in the year 1595. Earl Robert Stewart died in 1592, and his son Patrick did not receive his final Crown Charter of the Earldom of Orkney until 1600, it is therefore, evident that at least one person of the name of Traill was a landholder in Orkney between these two periods. Mr Spence, the late Crown Chamberlain of Orkney, held that two Traills came to Orkney with Earl Robert Stewart about 1585. In the appendix to Bell's Life of Queen Mary, in Constable's

Miscellany, it is stated that George Traill accom-panied Earl Robert Stewart to Orkney about the year 1580. Also, in a M.S. book which belonged to the late Anthony Trail, W.S., of Edinburgh, compiled from Genealogical papers drawn up by at least six descendants of the Traills of Blebo, there is an entry regarding Alexander Traill of Blebo in 1567 with the following statement:- " About this time two of the younger sons of the house of Blebo went to the Orkneys." These are of course only approximate dates, but, though it is perhaps too late now to find out the precise period at which the two families separated, there seems no rea-son to doubt their common lineage. It is some-what remarkable that John Traill of Westness, in the island of Rousay, Orkney, when making a disposition of his property, in 1795, included among his Trustees Dr William Traill, then Pro-fessor of Mathematics in Aberdeen, one of the Fife Traills, who married Lady Frances Charteris. Furthermore, in collecting materials for the subjoined Tabular Statement, I have, in one instance, at least, acquired information from the M.S. account of the Fife Traills, which I was unable to obtain from local sources, I

allude to Patrick Traill the last of the Traills of Sabay, as to whom I could find out little or nothing beyond the fact that he was a Major of Artillery, and that he had been obliged to part with his property from pecuniary embarrassment. However, on turning to the M.S. in question, I ascertained that he rose to the rank of General, that he was twice married, that he left a daughter by his first wife, who, about the year 1800, married a French Count, who was a Colonel in the British service: and that by his second wife, who was an American lady, he had a son who went to America with his maternal grandfather. The names of his wives and children were not given., but this and other statements scattered through the M.S. tend to show that the two 'branches of the family, though widely separated, had kept up more than a casual acquaintance with each other. Robert Nicholson., formerly Sheriff Substitute of Orkney, made up "Family Trees" for several Orkney gentlemen, more than 70 years ago; but considering the abundant materials he had access to in the shape of letters and documents suitable for such a purpose, it is much to be regretted that he prepared them in such a care-

less if not reckless manner, that they were full of errors and quite untrustworthy.

In his account of the Orkney Traills he states that George Traill, from Blebo in Fife, came to Orkney with Earl Robert Stewart in the capacity of Steward or Factor, that his first wife was Jean Kennedy of Carmunks, a near relation of the Cassilis family, and that his second wife was Isabel daughter of Sir William Craigie of Gairsay. Now, I can find no indication that George Traill had any management of Earl Robert's affairs, though in more than one document he is styled " Servitor to ane noble and potent Lord Patrick Earl of Orkney," and it is quite possible that he held some position of trust under both Earls.

Opinion is divided, also, as to whether his first wife was a Kennedy of Carmunks or of Bargeny; and with regard to the parentage of his second wife, Isabel Craigie, it is an un-doubted fact that George Traill died and left her a widow with 13 children in the year 1634, at least 8 or 10 years *before the birth* of Sir William Craigie! There is, however, some evidence to show that Isabel was the daughter of an ancestor of Sir William Craigie of Gairsay. It

is noticeable that the Fife Traills spelt their name in various ways. All of them with whom I am at present acquainted spell it *Trail*, whereas in Orkney it is invariably *Traill*. As this is a point of some interest, I should observe that in the course of my researches through the ancient Blebo records, formerly referred to, I found reason to believe that among the various forms of the name that from time to time pre-vailed, more authority exists for the spelling Traill than Trail.

The descendants of the Fife Trails who settled in Orkney were so far removed from the great centres of active life that they had not the same opportunity of distinguishing themselves in the busy world. They seem, however, to have very soon taken an active part in municipal affairs in Kirkwall. Their names frequently occur among the members of the Town Council, and not a few of them, from time to time, occupied the position of Provost of Kirkwall. Some went abroad, or served in the Army or Navy, or entered the Church. Thomas Traill, 1st of Holland, for some time served under Gustavus Adolphus in Germany. Robert Traill, of the Hobbister family, son of the Rev. Thomas Traill

of Lady Parish, Island of Sanday, when a young man went to Philadelphia, in America, in 1763. A descendant of his, the Rev. Edward Traill Horn, of Charleston, South Carolina, lately sent me the following short account of him, which presents the pleasing picture of a man attaining an honourable position, and winning the respect and esteem of his townsmen by sheer force of character. Mr S. Henry in his history of the Lehigh Valley wrote- "Robert Traill was the second or third resident lawyer in Easton. Of Mr Traill it may be said that in every respect he, for many years, was everything to every-body. Any inhabitant getting into difficulty was told. to go to Mr Traill, he will tell you what to do. If any writings were to be drawn up correctly, go to Mr Traill. If any secretary or clerk were wanting at any public meeting, Mr Traill was called upon to officiate. In 1776-7-8 he was Secretary to the Committee of Safety ; at another time Member of Assembly; in 1782 Sheriff, Clerk of Court, &c. Mr Traill was highly esteemed by all who knew him."

The Rev. George Traill of Hobbister, D.D., first cousin to the above Robert Traill, became minister of Dunnet in Caithness, his only son,

James, studied Law, became Sheriff of Sutherland and Caithness, married Lady Janet Sinclair, daughter of William 10th Earl of Caithness, and acquired much property in that county, including the valuable estate of Ratter.

James' eldest son, George, who also studied Law, was born in 1787 and for many years represented the County of Caithness in Parliament. George's nephew, James Christie Traill, Barrister-at-Law, London, is the present possessor of Ratter and Hobbister; and a younger brother of his, George Balfour Traill, Lieut.-Colonel Royal Artillery, served all through the Indian Mutiny, including the siege and capture of Delhi, relief and capture of Lucknow, &c. John Traill of Westness, grandson of William Traill, first of Westness, and great-grandson of James Traill, first of Weststove, was born in the early part of the last century. He inherited Westness from his father, George Traill, and as heir to his uncle, James Traill, he succeeded to the estate of Woodwick also. This latter property included the island of North Ronaldshay, a place formerly dreaded by mariners on account of the frequency of shipwreck on its shores. There is now a first-class lighthouse on the

island, but it is worthy of record that, in those somewhat lawless, times, John Traill received many written testimonials, besides money and plate to the value of £400, in recognition of his liberal and humane conduct, on occasion of divers shipwrecks there, from 1746 to 1791. Even in these remote regions his life was not one of undisturbed tranquillity; for having been suspected of favouring the cause of Prince Charles Edward, he was proscribed as a rebel, and along with Archibald Stewart of Brugh, William Balfour of Trenabie and John Traill of Elsness, he for some time took refuge in a cave in the island of Westray, ever since known as the Gentlemen's Cave. Meanwhile their dwelling houses were burned down, and their wives and families subjected to cruel hardships and privations. At length quieter times returned; but "Westness," who had been a man of 6 feet 6 inches in height, was bent with rheumatism for the remainder of his life. In the early part of the present century, George William Traill of the Westness family, entered the Indian Civil Service, where he long held an important and responsible appointment ; and on his return to Britain with an ample fortune, he purchased the

island of Rousay, in Orkney, which is now pos-sessed by his relative and heir, Lieutenant-General Traill Burroughs, C.B., late in command of the 93rd Sutherland Highlanders.

I may mention here that Mary Traill, aunt of the above named G. W. Traill, married Keith Spence, whose daughter, Harriet, married the Rev. Charles Lowell, father of his Excellency the Honourable James Russell Lowell, American Ambassador to England, who, in addition to being an able diplomatist, has long enjoyed and maintained a high reputation in the paths of literature.

I cannot conclude without a passing notice of the last representative of the Traills of Thurlet or Tirlet, as it is now usually called-Dr Thomas Stewart Traill, Professor of Medical Jurisprudence in the University of Edinburgh. He was a man of singularly varied talents and of no common attainments, possessing such extensive knowledge of many depart-ments of Science, that on several occasions he very ably discharged the duties of other Pro-fessorships during temporary vacancies; and at the time. of his death, which occurred in 1862, in his 81st year, he had just. completed the

onerous work of superintending a new edition of the Encyclopædia Britannica.

Plates I. and II. are fac-similes of wood carvings from the old house of Holland in Papa Westray. The first, which records the name of the first Traill of Holland and that of his wife, was one of the side panels in the old dining-room, which was a wainscotted room.

The " Welcome," in plate II., was the centre panel over the mantelpiece.

Of the two carved stones, represented in plate III., fig.1 was found near the site of the old house of Sabay, and the triangular stone (fig. 2), with the monogram, was subsequently discovered by the sea beach, at a considerable distance from where the old house stood. The present tenant, with a feeling that is very creditable to him, has had both stones carefully preserved. He remembers in his younger days a third stone with the names David Traill and Christian Skene in large letters carved in relief, being the names of the first Traill of Sabay and his wife. That stone, unfortunately, no longer exists; but the two that have happily been preserved, are most interesting relics, and evi-dently relate to the parents of the above David

Traill, namely, Patrick Traill of Elsness, and his spouse, Elspeth Pottinger.

It seems not improbable that when the old house of Elsness, in the island of Sanday, was burnt down, after the rebellion of 1745, one of the Traills of Sabay had the stones removed to his own house for their better preservation. They are, at all events, excellent specimens of the style of carving prevalent at that period, a few examples of which are yet to be seen in some of the old houses in Kirkwall.

It was the wish of some friends that the following pedigree table should comprehend all the other families of different names, with whom the Traills have intermarried, and their descendants; but I found that I could not obtain the requisite information for doing this in a complete and satisfactory manner, and even if it were carried out in its necessarily imperfect form it would have far exceeded the limits of the present brochure. I was, therefore, compelled to relinquish the attempt.

The table has, however, been arranged with a blank leaf at the end of each family, for the convenience of persons who wish to enter any additional names.

I am glad to take this opportunity of ex-pressing my indebtedness to many friends who have assisted me in this work, including David Balfour of Balfour, Thomas Traill of Holland, Professor Samuel Trail of Aberdeen, the late George Petrie of Kirkwall, Walter Traill Denni-son of Sanday, and, lastly, Henry Leask of Boardhouse, the extent of whose knowledge of Genealogy has been of the greatest service to me.

I may add that in making the following list I have spared no pains in obtaining documentary evidence whenever practicable, besides examin-ing public records, family Bibles, and inscriptions on monuments and tombstones, so as to ensure accuracy as much as possible. Should, however, any errors have crept in, I shall consider it a favour to have them pointed out, as I am most desirous that the pedigree table now drawn up may be relied upon as correct, if ever occasion should arise to refer to it.

I trust that it may at least prove of interest to the present generation of Orkney Trails who may wish to hunt up old names, which in some instances would be lost beyond recovery, unless they were preserved in some such record as the present.

According to Nisbet's Heraldry, the crest of the Traills of Blebo is, "A column set in the sea proper; motto *Discrimine Salus*." Arms of the first Traill of Blebo, "Azure, a chevron between two mascles in chief, Or, and a trefoil slipped in base, Argent." Their Orkney decend-ants have similar arms and crest. The seal of Bishop Walter Treyl has the same shield sup-ported by two lions.

The arrangement followed in the table is so simple that it hardly requires explanation. The numerals at the end of the names refer to the children : and correspond with subsequent numerals at the beginning of the names. If two or more numerals occur after a name, they refer to the children of two or more wives. The words in italics at the beginning of each family indicate the link or links that connects them with the parent stem.

The following abbreviations are used in the table, viz., b. born ; m. married ; m. c. marriage contract ; s. succeeded ; d. died ; d. un. died unmarried ; d. s . p. died without children.

NOTE.

It was only when the foregoing pages were in the hands of the printer that I came across the following verses said to have been written by Colonel Thomas Traill Ist of Holland, on parting with his lady love, when he went to join the forces of Gustavus Adolphus in Germany, about the year 1630.

On communicating with the family of the present Thomas Traill of Holland, I found that there had long been a tradition in their family that "Germany Thomas," as he was frequently styled, wrote the verses in question; but as considerable doubt has been expressed as to the authorship of the ballad, three, if not four, versions of which are still in existence, and as it is well known that Burns altered and adopted three of the verses into his popular song, "The red red rose," I prefer to give the verses as I found them, leaving my readers to judge for themselves; and for those who are curious in such matters I may state that very full particulars regarding this song are to be found in a book entitled "The Songs of Scotland, arranged with Pianoforte accompaniment, by George Far-

quhar Graham, in two volumes imperial octavo, published in 1861 by Oliver & Boyd, Edinburgh, and Simpkin, Marshall, & Co., London." (See notes in second volume, pages 9 and 29. Also, in the Appendix, at page 158 of the same volume.)

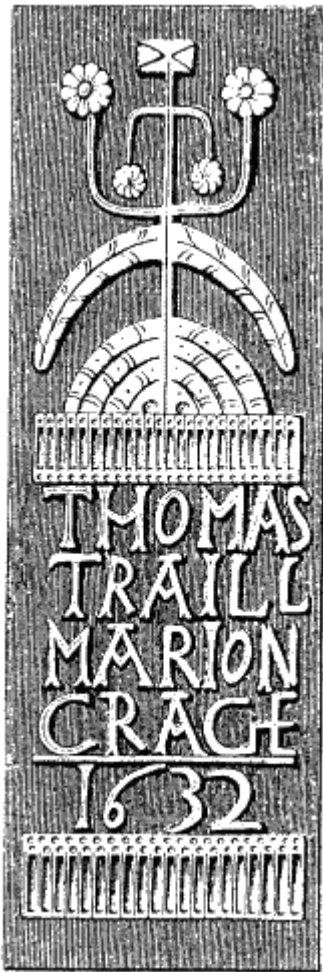

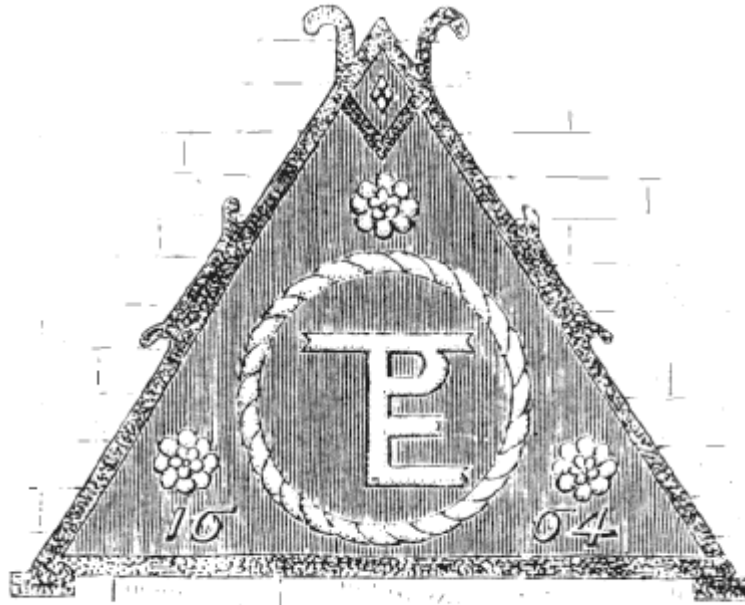

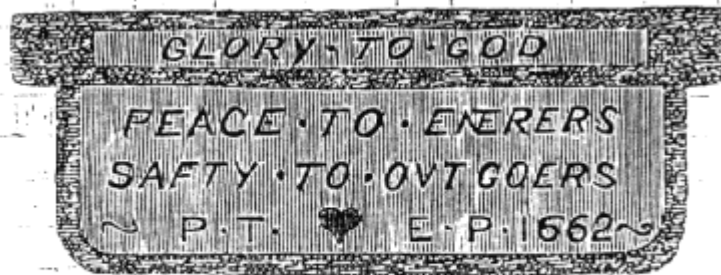
